1. Abraham and the Covenant (Genesis 12–25)

- יהוה called Abraham out of idolatry.
 - **Genesis 12:2–3 (ESV)** — “...I will make of you a great nation... and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.”
 - God made a covenant promising:
 1. Land
 2. A great nation
 3. A “seed” (offspring) through whom blessing would come
 - Abraham showed faith:
 1. **Genesis 15:6** — “He believed יהוה, and he counted it to him as righteousness.”
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2. Isaac, Jacob, and the Twelve Tribes (Genesis 25–50)

- Promise passed to:
 - Isaac → Isaac
 - Jacob (Israel) → Jacob
 - Jacob had 12 sons → became the tribes of Israel.
 - Family moved to Egypt during famine (through Joseph).
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3. Slavery in Egypt and the Exodus (Exodus–Deuteronomy)

- Israelites became enslaved in Egypt.
 - God raised up:
 - Moses
 - יהוה delivered them with great power (plagues, Red Sea).
 - Covenant Law given:
 - **Exodus 19:5–6** — Israel to be a “kingdom of priests.”
 - The Law defined worship, morality, and national life.
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4. Conquest and Judges (Joshua–Judges)

- Israel entered the Promised Land under:
 - Joshua
 - Afterward, cycles occurred:
 - Sin → oppression → repentance → deliverance
 - Judges were raised up to save Israel.
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5. The Kingdom Period (1 Samuel–2 Chronicles)

a. United Kingdom

- First kings:
 - Saul
 - David
 - Solomon
- Key promise to David:
 - **2 Samuel 7:12–13** — his throne would be established forever
→ Points to the Messiah

b. Divided Kingdom

- After Solomon:
 - Northern kingdom (Israel)
 - Southern kingdom (Judah)
 - Many kings turned to false worship.
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6. Prophets and Warnings

- God sent prophets to call people back:
 - Isaiah
 - Jeremiah
 - Ezekiel
 - Daniel
- They foretold:
 - Judgment for sin
 - Restoration
 - A coming Messiah

Example:

- **Isaiah 53:5** — “He was pierced for our transgressions...”
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7. Exile and Return

- Northern kingdom destroyed by Assyria.
 - Judah taken to Babylon (exile).
 - Later return under Persian rule:
 - Rebuilding of temple and Jerusalem.
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8. Continued Expectation of the Messiah

- Prophets gave more detail:
 - **Micah 5:2** — Messiah to be born in Bethlehem
 - **Daniel 7:13–14** — everlasting kingdom
 - People waited for:
 - A king from David's line
 - A deliverer and ruler
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9. Spiritual Condition Before Christ

- Worship continued (temple, Law), but:
 - Many traditions developed
 - True understanding was often lacking
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Summary of This Period

1. Abraham → covenant and promise begins
 2. Patriarchs → nation formed
 3. Exodus → nation delivered and given Law
 4. Land → Israel established
 5. Kingdom → promise to David
 6. Division → decline and idolatry
 7. Prophets → warnings and Messiah foretold
 8. Exile → discipline and restoration
 9. Expectation → awaiting the Messiah
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Key Theme

Throughout this entire period:

- יהוה preserves the **line of the promised “seed”**

- The promise becomes clearer:
 - From Abraham → to a nation
 - From David → to a king
- The Scriptures steadily point forward to the coming Messiah
